Cagayan Valley's Employment Rate in October 2023 is Estimated at 96.3 Percent

About 64.1 percent of the population 15 years old and over were in the labor force

The number of persons who were in the labor force was more than 2.5 million population aged 15 years old and over in the region for October 2023. This translates to a Labor Force Participation Rate (LFPR) of 64.1 or 641 in every 1000 population who were either employed or unemployed in October 2023, higher than the LFPR of the previous quarter (July 2023) and lower than the same period last year (October 2022) which is 61.3 and 64.8, respectively.

Employment rate registered at 96.3 percent

Employment rate in the Cagayan Valley Region in October 2023 was estimated at 96.3 (96.26) percent, translating to about 1.55 million employed. This was



Cagayan Valley Region's Inflation Rate for the Last Quarter of 2023 Decreases

Cagayan Valley Region's inflation rate decreased further to 1.6 percent in December 2023, from 3.4 percent in October 2023. Moreover. inflation November 2023 was higher at 0.8 percentage points compared to that of December of the same quarter. The average inflation for this quarter stood at 2.5 percent.

The region's Inflation was consistently lower than the average national inflation rate for the quarter. The decreasing trend of the region's inflation was attributed mainly to the decrease of the provinces' inflation particularly that of Cagayan, Isabela and Quirino.


The contributors in the downtrend of inflation in the region during this quarter were Food and Non-Alcoholic Beverages; Alcohol Beverages and Tobacco; Clothing and Footwear; Housing, Water, Electricity, Gas and Other Fuels; and Health.

Total Palay Production in Cagayan Valley Increase in 2023

In 2023. palay production in the Cagayan Valley Region increased to 3.3 percent, from 2,928,166 metric tons of the previous vear. Notably, an increase in the volume of production was noted in all quarters of 2023.


Across ecosystem, palay irrigated contributed about 90.9 percent to the total palay production of the region.

Across provinces, Isabela accounted for about one-half of the region's total palay production during the year in review followed by Cagayan with 37.2 percent, Nueva Vizcaya with 9.9 percent and Quirino with 4.0 percent. Batanes had the smallest share at 0.003 percent.

Of the total volume of production on irrigated palay, 51.1 percent was contributed by the province of Isabela. Additionally, about 34.3 percent came from Cagayan while the

remaining 14.5 percent was shared by Nueva Vizcaya and at 10.5 Quirino perccent and 4.0 percent, respectively.


Meanwhile, Cagayan contributed more than two-thirds to the total rainfed palay production of the region.

Cagayan Valley Registers 0.1 Percent Increase in Corn Production in 2023

Cagayan Valley's corn production increased in 2023 0.1 percent. from 1,960,108 metric tons of the same period of last year.


Batanes, with 0.02 percent contribution to the overall corn production of the region,




CORN: Volume of Production (in metric tons) by Quarter, Cagayan Valley, 2022 and 2023

registered the highest percentage increase among the provinces of Cagayan Valley. On the contrary, production of Isabela decreased during the year but remains to be the highest contributor to the corn production of the valley.


Across croptypes, yellow corn accounted about 99.5 percent of the total corn production. All provinces, except Batanes and Cagayan registered an increase in white corn and yellow corn production, respectively. The province of Quirino recorded the highest decrease in white corn production during the year at 80.8 percent while Nueva Vizcaya noted a decline of 5.1 percent in yellow corn production.


Livestock

The total livestock production of the Cagayan Valley Region improved in 2023 as it


posted an increase of 4.3 percent from its previous year's output of 55,429 metric tons, liveweight.

During the year, volume of Hog and Goat production increased at 10.6 percent and 1.2 percent, respectively which contributed to the increase in the volume of production of livestock.

Contrary to this, volume of production of cattle and carabao declined.



As of 30 September 2023, inventory of Carabao commodity posted the highest population from among the livestock commodities. This was followed by cattle with




171,525 heads, swine with 167,198 heads and goat with 97,369 heads.

Moreover, inventory of cattle, swine and carabao declined during the period in review at 9.2 percent, 4.6 percent and 1.6 percent, respectively.

Meanwhile, number of heads of goat increased by 2.5 percent from 94,959 in 2022.



In terms of inventory, duck registered an increase of 13.9 percent in the number of heads compared to the inventory captured in 2022 (as of 30 September). Meanwhile, chicken declined by 0.7 percent.

Building Constructions Dropped in the Last Quarter of 2023


Cagayan Valley's total number of constructions in the fourth quarter of 2023 was recorded at 1,118, 25.8 percent decrease from the 1,507 constructions recorded in the same quarter of 2022. Moreover, the total value of constructions in the region dropped 77.2 percent, from Php 1.8 billion to Php 1.5 billion.

Cagayan Province had the most constructions in the last quarter of 2021, with 689, accounting to 67.0 percent of total constructions in the region.


Residential construction had the highest number among the different types during the fourth quarter of 2023; which accounts to 792 constructions, or 70.8 percent of all constructions.

From among the provinces of the region, Cagayan had the most constructions in the last quarter of 2023, with 503, accounting to 45.0 percent of the total constructions in the region.



All types of construction declined except for Addition which improved during the quarter in review at 142.9 percent from 14 constructions during the fourth quarter of 2022.



Unemployment rate is recorded at 3.7 percent


Of the total 2.52 million aged 15 years and over, 0.06 million were unemployed which translates to 3.7 percent in October 2023. Comparing the quarter review's unemployment rate to same period of last year, it is higher by 1.3 Likewise, percent. the October 2023 rate was higher than that of the previous quarter's rate at 12.0 percent.

Underemployment rate registered at 12.8 percent


Underemployed persons or employed persons who expressed the desire to have additional hours of work in their present job or to have an additional job or to have a new job with longer hours of work was reported at 0.20 million of the 1.55 million employed population, translating to an underemployment rate of 12.8 percent in October 2023. The underemployment rate reported in October last year was lower at 19.5 percent.




Labor Market Statistics




For cattle, the province of Isabela had the most number of head counts as of 30 September 2023 with almost three-fourths of the total inventory of the region.




For Swine, about 45.0 percent of the total swine inventory was noted in the province of Cagayan. Moreover, Isabela shared almost 25.0 percent; Nueva Vizcaya registered almost 1/5 of the total swine inventory; while Quirino and Batanes shared 8.1 percent and 4.9 percent, respectively.

Over 40.0 percent of the total carabao inventory of the region is accounted to the province of Cagayan. This was followed by Isabela contributing almost 1/3 while the remaining percentage was contributed by the provinces of Nueva Vizcaya, Quirino at Batanes at 13.5 percent, 10.2 percent and 2.0 percent, respectively.




The province of Cagayan noted a share 29.9 (29.93) percent to the overall goat inventory of Cagayan Valley. Isabela followed contributing to 29.9 percent while the remaining 40.2 percent came from the provinces of Nueva Vizcaya, Quirino and Batanes.





From among the provinces in the region, Isabela contributed over 50.0 percent to the total chicken inventory, followed by Cagayan with 22.5 percent share. Additionally, Quirino noted over 1/8 of the region's total inventory while remaining the 11.6 percent was shared by Nueva Vizcava and Batanes.



Of the total chicken inventory, Native/Improved had the highest percentage share at 67.6 percent. This was followed by Broiler at 20.6 percent and Layer with a share of 11.8 percent.
